Giant 3-Year-Old Blueberry Bushes **Cost \$12**

Austin *Brightwell *Premier *Vernon Early season, usually starts ripening mid-June.

*Centurion * Powderblue Late season starts ripening mid-late July. *pink Lemonade Mid to late season beautiful rose-colored fruit Blueberries are relatively pest-free and require little care once established. The average family needs 4 to 6 bushes. You can plant as few as 2 plants as long as you have 2 varieties for cross-pollination. Full sun. Will produce a small quantity of berries the first year and produce up to 2 gallons per bush after 3 years. Plant 4 to 6 ft. apart for a hedge/screening or 10 to 12 ft. apart for specimen plants.

<u>Fig</u> **Cost \$7** 1 gallon

*Brown Turkey - Medium-sized, bronze-colored fruit excellent for preserving and good for fresh use.

Blackberry Thornless Cost \$6 1 gallon

Self-fertile, sun, some shade, space 2 ft., thornless, pest-free, little care, winter pruning, yields 3 to 4 pints per plant.

- *Apache Firm fruit, overall rated between Arapaho and Navaho. Mid-season, ripens late June for 5 weeks.
- *Arapaho Firm fruit, non-aggressive. Early season, ripens mid- to late June for 4 weeks.
- *Navaho Firm fruit, high-sugar, non-aggressive. Late season, ripens early to mid-July for 5 weeks.
- *Triple Crown-Yields large, glossy black firm fruit. Ripens mid to late season.

Strawberry Cost \$12 25 plants = 1 bundle

San Andreas - Disease-resistant, hardy, 1-2 in. fruit size. Several harvests each year. Can grow in containers. Sun. Heavy feeder. *Evie-2 - Glossy red, good-tasting, nice-size fruit throughout growing season. Each plant yields more than a quart of berries per season.

Cost \$6 **Raspberry**

Caroline Red – Pink fruit, everbearing, self-pollinating, large firm fruit, self-pollinating, keep 100 feet away from black raspberries *Heritage Red - Everbearing, self-supporting, upright canes. Large dark red, sweet berries. Ripens in July, then repeats in September.

*Latham - Firm, large, medium-red fruit, with a delicious flavor. Heavy-bearing. Ripens in June to July.

Muscadine Vines Cost \$6

*Granny Val - Bronze self-fertile, high yield, excellent quality. Ripens mid to late season. Very heavy producer

*Tara - large, tasty, bronze-colored fruit, and is self-pollinating,

- *Jumbo female cultivar, requires nearby self-fertile Muscadine; a thick-skinned, large black grape with spicy, sweet flavor
- *Fry Female variety that must be planted within 50 feet of a self-fertile variety. Large fruit with excellent quality
- *Scuppernong Female, bronze with medium to large fruit, excellent quality, mid-season. Most widely grown variety of the muscadines

Crape Myrtle Cost \$7/25 1gal/5 gal

*Natchez (White Bloom) -Tall tree, white flowers, glossy, dark green leaves turn a vibrant orange/red in fall. Cinnamon bark.

*Sioux 5 gal only – pink, heavy bloomer

Gardenia Cost \$7 1 gal

*Frost Proof - to 4' tall, huge, heavy-scented, velvety white flowers. Evergreen. Grows in full sun or partial shade.

Cost \$7/11 1 gal/2 gal

- *Blue Pacific (1 gal)- Dense, 12-18 in. tall conifer with aromatic, gray/green or blue/green needle-like leaves about a half-inch long.
- *Gold Lace (1 gal) Vibrant gold foliage is outstanding in all seasons, becoming brighter yellow in summer
- *Parsoni (1 gal/2 gal) Dense, evergreen, bluish-green foliage. Domelike mound grows 2-3 ft. x 4-10 ft. Excellent ground cover. Full sun.
- *Viridis (1 gal/2 gal) Thick, heavy branches that make an excellent groundcover, rich evergreen green. 2'tall 10' wide.

^{*}Blushing - Long period of hot pink double blossoms. Vigorous shrub.

^{*}Double Red - prolific bloomer of medium - large deep red flowers

^{*}Red – Nice basic red KO rose

^{*}Sunny - Fragrant, bright yellow flowers, resistant to common rust, mildew and black spot foliage diseases.

- *Coral Bell (1) earliest bloomer, masses of coral-pink blooms on dense plant
- *Delaware Valley White (1 gal/3 gal)- Medium-sized single white blossoms bloom mid-season. It grows 2-4 ft. x 3-5 ft.
- *Girard's Crimson red (1 gal)- Rosy red/crimson mid-season blooms and great fall color, growing to 3 x 3 ft. in size.
- *Girard's Rose (1/3 gal) Heavy bloomer, mid-season, single, deep red/rose color. Grows 3 ft. tall and wide.
- *Hilda Niblett (1 gal) Pink/white 4-inch flowers, 1 ft. tall and 3-4 ft. spread. One of a kind!
- *Hino Crimson (1/3). - masses of single crimson blooms in early spring

1 gal/3 gal

- *Green Luster (1/3 gal) A great shrub for foundation planting a small hedge or mass planting
- *Needlepoint (1/3 gal)- Valued for its delicate, narrow, twisted leaves and heavy crop of bright red fruit that lasts through winter
- *Soft Touch (1/3 gal) Tiny spring flowers; black berries in winter and fall; small, glossy, smooth leaves.

*Pink double. *Purple *Red *White Large flowers appear in April, re-bloom in early July, solid color blooms.

Camellia PM shade for all Cost \$11/26

- *Alabama Beauty (1/3) -- heavy red semi-double, blooms in fall
- *Professor Sargent (1/3) red, double blooms in early spring
- *Rose Dawn (1/3) deep-rose, heirloom double, mid-season
- *Yultide (1/3) single bright red with yellow center, winter

Loropetalum **Cost \$19**

*Sizzling pink - Clusters of rich, pink fringed flowers repeat throughout the year. Showy new growth is deep burgundy

Cost \$15 1 gallon Native Azalea

- *Aubie strong yellow just as you expect from the Auburn Mascot
- *Baker Dean deep red.
- *Chapola River Austrinum This outstanding azalea bears bright gold flowers, with a background of dark apricot.
- *Earl's Atlanticum Nice white fragrant blooms early in the season
- *Jack Melton Red blooms in early Spring, 8" to 12"
- *Magenta Rose Flame Orange to red blooms with a yellow blotch
- *Pierce Whiddon Large salmon to pink blooms
- *Pink Flammeum pink with coral highlights
- *Varnadoe's Salmon Salmon/yellow blossoms
- *Vivian Abney pink with yellow spot Flammeum grows to 8 feet, our plants come from Vivian herself!

3 <u>gal</u> **Cost \$20**

- *Firelight large 12-16" deep pink flowers summer to fall
- *Limelight Chartreuse, prolific, mid-summer blooms change to pink then brown in fall
- *Silver dollar Small paniculata with large, lacy creamy-white incredible blooms hold flowers upright

Viburnum Coat \$19 <u>3gal</u>

These plants are very disease-resistant, and have a striking appearance year-round.

- *Summer Snowflake Shrub with flowering like Shasta but small overall size. Deciduous, deer resistant
- *Spring Bouquet Evergreen shrub, pink to white blooms give off a nice fragrance, happy in full to part sun, 4 to feet tall
- *Conoy compact, white snowball flower, very fragrant, prefers pm shade, evergreen, tolerates drought well

Kalmia (mountain laurel, part sun) 1 gal

*Carol – bright red buds open to white flower, spring blooms, dwarf evergreen

*Tinkerbelle – mini, 2 -3' plant, deep pink buds open to light pink flowers, spring blooms, dwarf evergreen

<u>Nineba</u>rk *Tiny Wine –dwarf bronzy leaves, dainty white to pink flowers, 3 -4' tall shrub, ok drought, Clay-Dry- Shallow-Rocky soil

Cost \$20

Rhododendron

- *Firestorm –rich, red bloom, vigorous 3-4
- * Native bright lavender pink, commonly called Carolina rhododendron, mostly shade
- *Wojner's Purple -showy purple flowers, compact habit, part shade to shade

Perennials 1 gal/2 gal

Agastache

*Blue fortune - Elegant spikes laden with soft powder blue flowers and fragrant foliage

- *Bridal Veil (white) A white Astilbe with elegant, well-branched spikes
- *Montgomery large plumes of dark red to magenta flowers stalks, part sun to full sun

- *Autumn Fern Prefers shade; known for spring color of copper and orange developing into a beautiful green. (1 and 2 gal)
- *Japanese Holly like shady moist areas, meat compact, rugged evergreen
- *Japanese Painted Fern Grows 12 to 18 in. tall with silver green and maroon foliage. This fern is a standout in the shade.
- *Tassel Fern New fronds turn to tassels then bright green, full shade to part shade

Hemerocallis

*Stella Supreme—dwarf, differs from Stella d'oro in its lemon yellow flowers, re-bloomer

Heuchera (Coral Bells)

- *Amber Lady mini, amber with silver marbling, rose pink blooms, prefers pm shade
- *Caramel Caramel leaves and Tiny, light pink flowers appear in spires in early summer.

<u>Hucherella</u>

- *Buttered Rum warm, coppery tones, prefers pm shade
- *Golden Zebra bold, bright yellow leaves marked with dark red, prefers pm shade

Platycodon

*Sentimental Blue- Flower buds shaped like hot air balloons, Emerges very late in the spring, full sun to part shade
